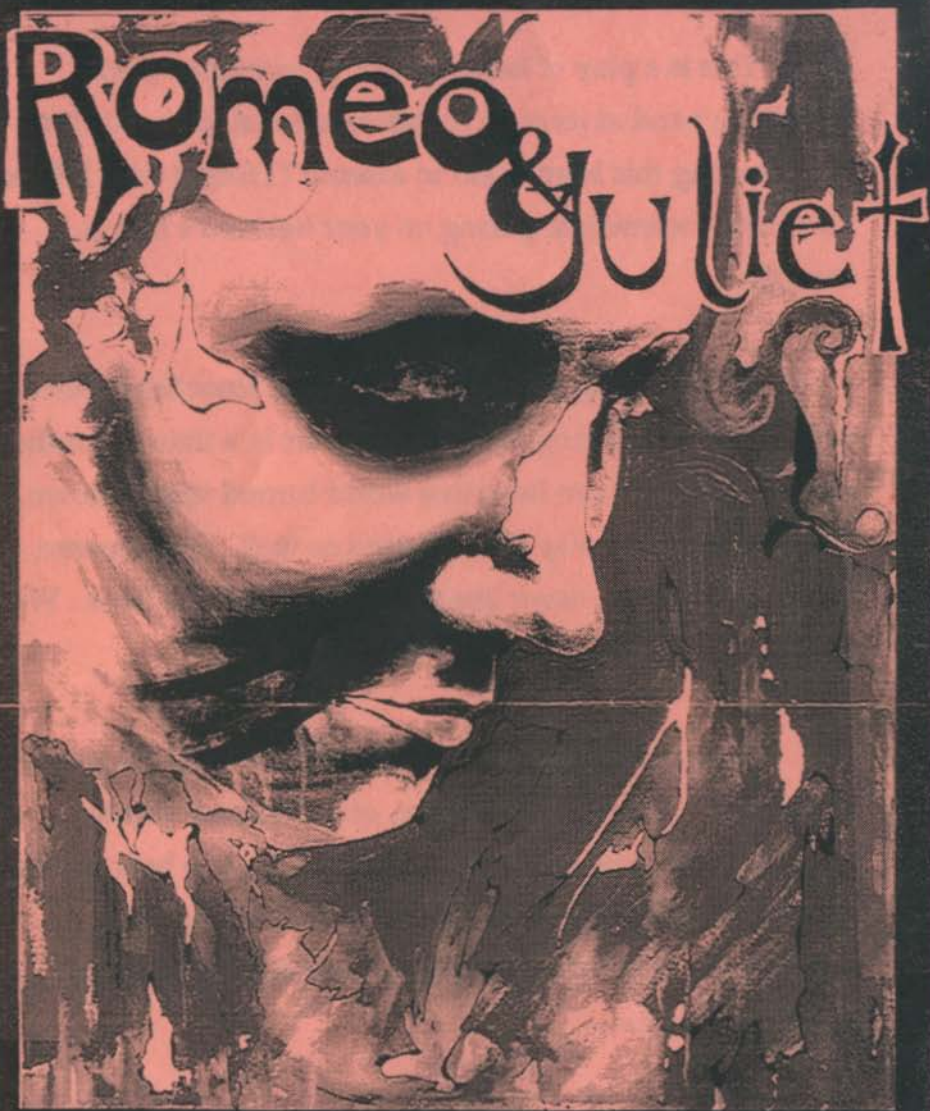



This is of course a play about hatred as well. Shakespeare, being who he was, never lets the audience off the hook. We achieve reconciliation, but at what price?

Once again our headlines vividly describe the agonizing implications of cycles of violence, of individual, ethnic, cultural, even national enmity. The bad news is how familiar the words of the Montagues and Capulets sound, each accusing the other of responsibility for the pain, loss and destruction of lives.
