

Much ink has been spilled in efforts to divine his intentions as to the story's conclusion, but as Mr. Dickens kept no plot outlines regarding this work, the conclusion is anybody's guess... and that means yours as well!

And so... **Welcome** to the *Music Hall Royale*, whose company, an intrepid troupe of Victorian actors, is thrilled to be putting on its premiere performance of "The Mystery of Edwin Drood," and (in a boldly democratic move) invites you, the audience members, to **VOTE** on the ending which Mr. Dickens was unable to provide. 
