

We present to you a charming little play called "Lovers and Other Strangers", Written by Joseph Bologna and his wife Rene Taylor, "Lovers and Other Strangers" is full of culture, pride, and humor. Ella Cooley (Los Vendidos)

Los Vendidos literally puts Mexican stereotypes on display. The play was originally performed by farm workers in the fields of California, and translates to "the sellouts" or "those who are sold". By confronting stereotypes in a very blatant manner, Luis Valdez & El Teatro Campesino shed light on the injustices done Chicanos in the 1960s. Los Vendidos helped El Teatro Campesino gain recognition, and propelled them to the helm of the Chicano theatre movement. Although the play was written in response to a certain political and social climate, its message can easily be extended to a more universal one of acceptance and celebration of one's culture.
