

This is perhaps the most unabashedly patriotic play I have ever directed. In polarized political times such as these (as well as 1954, the year Brown vs. Board of Education ruling was made and when this play was written) it is instructive to remember that our democracy is fueled, and made real, by the spirited discussion of issues by engaged and informed citizens in honest disagreement. Democracy isn't easy, and sometimes it's downright messy. One of the *most* difficult things one can do, but guaranteed by our constitution, is to stand alone, holding to an unpopular opinion.

This marvelous script penned by Reginald Rose for the television drama series Studio One, when dramatic productions were broadcast *live* across the country, argues, if indirectly, that the height of civilization is demonstrated by the right of a defendant to be tried by a jury of one's peers, and to be considered innocent until *proven* guilty. It is almost a miracle, really, that the fate of an accused lies in the hands not of a king, or a highly paid expert, but ultimately, and whether we like it or not, of twelve ordinary people required by law to take time out of their lives to come to consensus upon a verdict of guilty or not guilty. Rose's teleplay was made into the much loved 1957 film (starring Henry Fonda as Juror #8) directed by first-timer Sydney Lumet.

As Juror #11 reminds us: "We have a responsibility. This is a remarkable thing about democracy... that we are notified by mail to come down to this place and decide on the guilt or innocence of a man, of a man we have not known before. We have nothing to gain or lose by our verdict. This is one of the reasons why we are strong."
